Cooperative Christian Ministry

Averaged 36 housing applications a month, some months averaging 1 per day.

Conducted 246 housing applications, totalling 839 people.

Cabarrus County and Kannapolis City Schools

During the 2016-2017 school year, 451 students were identified as homeless.

- Cabarrus County Schools: 329
- Kannapolis City Schools: 122

Coordinated Assessment

135 households were wait listed for housing.

The average household size for families dealing with housing issues is **3.4**. This means roughly459 were wait listed.

Cabarrus County Jail

In 2016, **43** inmates released from Cabarrus County jail listed 'streets' as their place of residence. **30%** of those had repeat arrests.

Crisis Housing Shelter

The Salvation Army, Cabarrus County's only crisis housing shelter, served 230 un-duplicated individuals from January to September 2017.



Substance Use Treatment **Facilities**

In 2016, Daymark Recovery Services had **46** clients identify as homeless. This does not include those that reported staying with family or friends.

Point in Time Count

From 2015 to 2017, there was a 7.8% increase in the recorded number of homeless individuals in Cabarrus County.

This included a 46% increase in the number of homeless families and a 41% increase in homeless children.

Evictions & Foreclosures

On any given day, 3 families are evicted from their home in Cabarrus County. An average of 95 evictions occur monthly, totaling 855 from January to September of 2017.

Within the first nine months of 2017, there were **384 foreclosures** in Cabarrus County. Meaning that nearly **43** families per month were displaced from their home and looking for relocation.
